RULES

1. The show is open to any amateur exhibitor.
2. Exhibitors pay entry fee on the morning of the show, 10p per exhibit for members, 20p per exhibit for non members, Junior classes and Scarecrow class are free entry. No more than two exhibits per class may be entered.
3. All exhibits shown in sections 1-3 must be grown by the exhibitor.
4. Entries close at 5:00pm on the Thursday before the show, please note late entries will not be accepted.
5. Exhibits must arrive at the showroom between 10.00am and 11.45am on the day of the show, please help by bringing exhibits early.
6. No exhibitor is allowed in the showroom during judging unless authorised by the officials.
7. Exhibits not for auction should be removed by 3:15pm.
8. Entrants must have grown, nurtured, made or crafted their exhibits themselves, if, in the opinion of the judges, the entry does not conform to the above, it will be disqualified.
9. The decision of the judges is final and no discussion will be entered into.
10. If the entrant incurs more than one disqualification the committee reserves the right to take further action.
11. In the Craft section entries may be made from patterns or kits, if from a kit the make and the major materials used should be specified.

The Committee regrets having to make clear these rules, but it is necessary to maintain the spirit of true competition. All entrants will be deemed to have agreed to these conditions.

NOTES

- a. Exhibitors are asked, where possible, to donate their exhibits for sale on behalf of club funds, except pasty and quiche.
- b. First, second and third prize cards are competed for in each class, an award may not be made, if in the opinion of the judges, the required standard in that class is not reached.
- c. Trophy's as listed are to be held for one year. Membership required from January in the year of entry to qualify for member only trophies.
