Minutes of Parish Council Meeting held in Lyon Hall, Hodnet on Thursday 9th January 2014

Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on Thursday 12 December 2013

Amendments to Minutes Item 66 – Shropshire Council Enforcement Officer is Mark Southern Amendments to Minutes Item 65 – Ian Walshaw indicated that the creation of a second ditch was a possible solution to the flooding problem but did not undertake to carry out such works Subject to the above amendments Councillor Morgan proposed the minutes be signed as a true record of proceedings seconded by Councillor Cope all agreed.

Matters Arising

77. Hearne Lane Depot – Item 4

Councillor Cope is concerned that there is no gritting to Drayton Road. A recent accident caused by icy conditions has highlighted this problem. Motorist are leaving the A41and A53 which are gritted assuming that the Drayton Road will be similarly treated. Bearing in mind that this road is very well used it was decided that Council would write to Ian Walshaw requesting that Drayton Road be included in the gritting area or alternatively signage advising that no gritting has taken place. Councillor Parker advised that it would be preferable that Station Road from the Fire Station to the Mini Roundabout is also included in the gritting area.

Councillor Hodge is arranging for a meeting of the Liaison Group very shortly and will mention the gritting problem.

78. Access to the Wetland – Item 16

Councillor Underwood had advised Council that all works have been completed on the footpath and the formal orders have been received. He proposed that all the people who provided statements for support, the various property owners and Shropshire Council Outdoor Recreation be formally thanked for their contribution in creating the new footpath. All agreed and the Clerk will send out letters accordingly. Councillor Hodge wished to formally record the Parish Council's grateful thanks to Councillor Underwood who has tirelessly steered this long running matter to such successful conclusion

79. Enforcement Issues – Item 37

Councillor Trevor reported that vehicles are now parked within the designated site. It would appear that the visiting families have moved on and for the time being there are no nuisance issues.

80. Hodnet Development Abbots Way – Item 43

Councillor Hodge was disappointed to advise that no agreement between the parties had been reached in respect of the 106 Agreement. In addition there were outstanding issues

- ② Highways contribution
- Viability of Affordable Housing

Recent correspondence from Strutt Parker indicated that they were still hopeful of a resolution before the Appeal date. However Councillor Hodge felt the Council must prepare for the Appeal and he will attend for the Council if required.

81. Football Netting – Item 73

The netting has arrived and will be erected for the next scheduled match on 25th January. The L.J.C Project Feedback Form will have to be completed upon receipt of the Invoice.

82. Speeding in Marchamley – Item 758

Councillor Powell was disappointed to read the correspondence regarding speeding in Marchamley. PC Sturland had advised that until such time that Shropshire Council introduced traffic calming measures then he cannot carry out enforcement . In addition it is difficult to find a safe location in which to operate a held hand device then stop vehicles.

There followed a general discussion on speeding within the Parish. It was felt that although Wollerton has the same enforcement issue as Marchamley that vehicles have in general slowed down through Wollerton since the introduction of the speed limit signs.

83. H4 Street Light – Item 76

Councillor Powell suggested that column for Street Light H4 be renewed. The existing wooden pole is over 40 years old. At the same time the untidy overhead cabling could be replaced. The Clerk will obtain quotes for the work.

84. Parish Plan – Annual Place Plan Review

it was agreed that the following items be recorded for CIL priorities in the Annual Review

- ① Improvements to Recreation Ground equipments e.g multi activity pitch
- ② Community facility improvements
- Wollerton to Hodnet footpath
- ② Pod/Shelter for Recreation Ground
- ① Improvements to Pre School playgroup buildings
- ① Improvements for local meeting centres e.g Lyon Hall, Scout & Guides Hall
- ② Car Parking improvements for Primary School and support for existing services

Councillor Calder advised of the forthcoming CIL and Project Management Training – Councillors Hodge and Mackie will attend the North Area Training Session at Wem Council Chamber on 3rd March.

85. Precept 2013/2014

The Clerk advised that details regarding the precept had been received from Shropshire Council . In order to show a 0% increase in the Band D Council Tax charge on the 2014/2015 Council Tax Demand Notices, Hodnet Parish Council precept requirement would need to be £15284. The Council Tax Support Grant available from Shropshire Council for 2014/2015 is £1495. Thus a 0% increase would mean that the Parish Council would receive £16779 in total against £16806 received for 2013/2014.

It was proposed by Councillor Morgan that a precept total of £16779 be requested for 2014/15 Seconded by Councillor Powell, all agreed.

- a) KG Landscaping have requested confirmation for renewal of contract for grass cutting in 2014. In line with the Council's Financial Regulation another quote must be obtained. The Clerk was instructed to request a quote from KS Landscapes.
- b) Ms Davies is concerned at the poor visibility in emerging from Church Street on to Shrewsbury Street. Historically the windows of the shop opposite afforded drivers some assistance in seeing oncoming traffic but since the property has reverted to residential this is no longer available. It was agreed that there is a road safety issue and the Clerk was instructed to raise this with Dave Gradwell Traffic Engineer at Shropshire Council to arrange a site visit to explore possible solutions.
