HODNET PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes of the Parish Council meeting held in the Lyon Memorial Hall, Hodnet on Thursday 20th January 2011

Present: Councillors Mr M. Morgan (Chairman), Mr J. Powell (Vice-chairman), Mr N. Newitt, Mr A. Cope, Mrs A. Taylor, Mr R. Underwood, Mr J. Parker, Mrs R. Revel Mr H. Trevor and Mr R. Downes. Also present was Mr S. Howell-Jones (Clerk) and two members of the public.

Apologies: Councillor Mr D. Hodge

The Chairman brought forward the Item on the Agenda re the Supplementary Planning Document, for the benefit of the two members of the public.

The main point for the Parish Council to consider was the proposed policy regarding affordable housing in the Hodnet area. After reading the 59 page document, the Chairman came to the conclusion that as there was so much red tape and so many 'hoops' to jump through for potential developers, he considered the chances of any affordable housing being built in the parish as remote. He had talked to a local architect, who advised the bureaucracy attached to building programmes was killing the trade. He assured the members of the public that there were no planning applications for affordable housing in the area and as things stood, none were expected.

Demand for affordable housing for local people was dependant on numbers being on the official Housing List, but members felt there should be other and easier ways of establishing demand as not all people who wished to live in the locality were on the Housing List.

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Councillor Taylor proposed the minutes be signed as a true record of proceedings, seconded by Councillor Cope and all agreed.

121. Access to the Wetlands from Wollerton - Item 101

The Clerk advised that Lucy McFarlane (SC) was waiting to hear from Mr Peat before progressing the matter further.

122. State of Roads - Item 102

Awaiting a progress report from Councillor Calder re the provision of salt boxes.

Councillor Morgan asked that Shropshire Council be informed of a blocked drain in Wood Lane, Wollerton, which had caused flooding, forcing motorists to drive on the wrong side of the road.

123. Bean Bank, Wollerton - State of Road Surface - Item 103

Masta Pave has confirmed the price for full resurfacing work in Bean Bank does include a dense base course. Meres & Mosses have promised to contribute £1000 +VAT towards overall costs. The Clerk advised he had written to, and left messages with Severn Trent, but to date had not received a reply. The 8 privately owned houses would be contacted once Severn Trent had made a commitment.

124. Collapsed Culvert – Old Railway Line – Item 105

Having been read an E-mail from Gareth Egarr (SC) stating the barbed wire fencing was completely satisfactory, Councillor Parker again insisted this was not the case and constituted a health & safety issue. He further suggested that children could still access the culvert along the stream. It was suggested that boarding up of the culvert should be initiated, ensuring enough space beneath the board(s) to allow for free flowing of any water. The Clerk was asked to write again to Mr Egarr.

125. Speeding Traffic - Station Road, Drayton Road and Lostford - Item 107

The Clerk advised he had written to the complainants and informed them of the action being taken by Arriva to eliminate the problem of speeding buses. P.C. Sturland had advised he would use the Laser Gun to reduce speeding in the area and would also introduce 30mph stickers on wheelie bins in Drayton Road and Shrewsbury Street. However, he felt it would not be worthwhile in Marchamley or Wollerton.

126. Espley Roundabout – Sponsorship – Item 109

Shropshire Council stated that because the Espley Roundabout was in a de-restricted speeding area, Community Services (West Mercia Probation Trust) were not able to utilize the services of the young offenders as they could only work in areas up to 40mph. As for the tree guards, young offenders could not undertake the work as knives would be required, which are banned. SC also advised that the ownership of the hedgerows with tree guards had now passed back to the original owners.

127. Vacancy for Parish Council Clerk – Item 111

The Chairman advised members that there were 7 applications for the vacancy and proposed that a Selection Committee be set up to conduct interviews. It was agreed that Councillors Mr Powell, Mr Cope and Mr Newitt form the committee, together with the Chairman. Deadline for all applications was set at 10th February 2011.

128. Hodnet Pharmacy – Archive Material – Item 115

Councillor Underwood advised that prior to handing over the Archive material to Hodnet Medical Centre, he had inserted a brief note which stated that the book remained the property of Hodnet Parish Council. He also mentioned that information regarding the book had been put on the Hodnet Website.
