Outline of the route

This walk, mainly in **woodland**, starts[^] near Webster Lane Farm (two sets of roadside parking) - which is accessed off the bypass via a cattle grid or PG.

^It can also be easily walked to from Hodnet, via Webster Lane.

To start, go down a track (a bridleway) with a pool on your right. Upon reaching woodland, keep to the track down the left side—the woods are private property.

At the end of the first block of woodland, the track curves left then right and passes a field, on the right, to reach **Tunstall Wood**. It is in this area of more open/mixed woodland that you can see, usually in May, a good display of natural **Bluebells**, as well as other **Woodland Flowers**. At 'A' you can return the way you came or head to Tunstall Farm.

Option. At 'A' cross a ST and, keeping woodland on your left, go down the field. Where the woodland ends continue downhill, passing 2 electricity poles on your left (located in the next field), to reach a BR over a small stream. Go through a FG on the other side to enter a grazing meadow where, in spring, there are some Wild Daffodils. Go diagonally left across this meadow towards an oak tree by Tunstall Farm. Here the path turns right, past the rear of some farm buildings, to officially end* by a FG joining the farm's driveway.

* Important: There is no right of access beyond this point, so you need to return the way you came.

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
