

ST LUKE'S CHURCHYARD

I'm sure many of us, certainly the younger generation, don't give much thought to where our earthly remains will rest for eternity. Take a walk through Hodnet Churchyard, where many long-term residents of the parish have ancestors buried. At first glance, it may be not what you think. The current area being used for interments, be it burials or burial of ashes, is part of the oldest area where our antecedents lie. Look to the south side, nearest to the Marchamley road, and you will see a wall created of old gravestones, which, along with those used to pave the War Memorial site, were removed from this area to allow for more burials. Many of these memorials date back to the 18th and 19th century. So this ground is being used for the second time that we know about, but in reality it will have been used many times over, bearing in mind the Church dates from the Norman period. The previous plot was the ground to the west, which was for many years known as the 'New Graveyard'. This piece of ground was donated by A H Heber Percy, on the condition that the Parish erect the wall against the Marchamley road. This was created from stone from the original redundant and dilapidated Boy's School, which was situated near the entrance to the Hearne Farm. The work was financed by subscription, and with volunteer labour, and was completed in 1921. It was suggested at the time that there would be space to last 70 or 80 years, but the first new burial to the East behind the Hundred House was in 1988.

So we may say 'Rest in Peace' but it won't necessarily be for ever!

VOTING AND PHOTO ID

Voter ID requirement - from 4th May 2023, votes in England will need to show photo ID to vote at polling station in some elections. This will apply to:

- Local elections
- Police and Crime Commissioner elections
- UK parliamentary by-elections
- Recall petitions

From October 2023 it will also apply to UK General elections.

If you don't have accepted photo ID, you can apply for a free voter ID document, which is known as a Voter Authority Certificate.

ST LUKE'S ORGAN RESTORATION UPDATE

All of the flue pipework is back in situ and the organ is now playable. It needs to be played as often as possible.

As I wrote last time, the reeds are currently away. When they're repaired and can be returned, we will tune the organ.

The pipes that are missing from the cases are missing for very good reasons. The two pipes facing into the church need repairing and the two big brutes missing from the great side (left side) would have to be removed again so that we can put the clarinet back in. These cases are extremely heavy and the metal which they are made of is very soft and, therefore, very easily damaged. Much time has been spent in 'rounding out' all of the 64 pipes that you can see. The largest measure 10'6" in length and to describe them as awkward would be a massive understatement.

or the election of Parochial representatives of the laity as follows:

- To the Parochial Church Council 10 representatives.
- To the Deanery Synod three representatives. For the appointment of Sidesmen and the Independent Examiner or Auditor. For the consideration of:
- a) A Report on changes in the roll since the annual parochial church meeting;
- An Annual Report of the proceedings of the parochial church council and the activities of the parish generally;
- The Financial Statements of the Council for the year ending on the 31st December immediately preceding the meeting audited or independently examined;
- d) A Report on the fabric, goods and ornaments of the church or churches of the parish;
- e) A Report on the proceedings of the Deanery Synod and other matters of parochial or general Church interest.

NOTES

3.

- All persons whose names are entered upon the Church Electoral Roll of the parish (and such persons only) are entitled to vote at the
 election of parochial representatives of the laity.
- 2. Subject to the provisions of rule 14(3)(c) a person is qualified to be elected a parochial representative of the laity if
- their name is entered on the church electoral roll of the parish and, unless they are under the age of eighteen years at the date of the election, has been so entered for at least the preceding period of six months;
- b) the person is an actual communicant which means that they have received Communion according to the use of the Church of England or of a Church in communion with the Church of England at least three times during the twelve months preceding the date of the election and;
- c) the person is sixteen years or upwards and d) the person is not disqualified as referred to in paragraph 3 of these notes.
 - a) A person shall be disqualified from being nominated, chosen or elected from serving as a churchwarden, a member of a parochial church council, a district church council or any synod under these rules if he is disqualified from being a charity trustee under sec tion 178 of the Charities Act 2011 and the disqualification is not for the time being subject to a general waiver by the Charity Com missioners under subsection (4) of that section or to a waiver by them under that subsection in respect of all ecclesiastical charities established for purposes relating to the parish concerned.
 - (aa) A person shall be disqualified from being nominated, chosen or elected or from serving as a churchwarden or member of a parochial church council, a district church council or any synod under these rules if the person is included in a barred list (within the meaning of the Safeguarding Vulnerable Groups Act 2006).
 - (ab) A person shall be disqualified from being nominated, chosen or elected or from serving as a churchwarden or member of a parochial church council, a district church council or any synod under these rules if the person has been convicted of an offence mentioned in Schedule 1 to the Children and Young Persons Act 1933.
 - (ac) A person's disqualification under paragraph (ab) may be waived by the bishop of the diocese in question giving the person notice in writing.
 - b) A person shall also be disqualified from being nominated, chosen or elected from serving as a churchwarden or member of a parochial church council if they have been so disqualified from holding office under section 10(6) of the Incumbents (Vacation of Benefice) Measure 1977.
- Any person whose name is on the electoral roll may be appointed as a sidesman.
- 5. \$\frac{4}{2}\$ A resolution is in operation in this parish which provides that any person entitled to vote in the elections of parochial representatives of the laity to the parochial church council or to the deanery synod or to both that council and that synod may make application on the appropriate form to the undersigned for a postal vote. The completed form must be received before the commencement of the Annual Parochial Church Meeting.

NOTE — In this notice "parish" means an ecclesiastical parish.

 \S'' Ecclesiastical charity'' has the same meaning as that assigned to that expression in the Local Government Act 1894.

‡This paragraph should be deleted if no resolution for postal voting is in operation in the parish.

**Or "Vice-Chairman of the Parochial Church Council" as the case may be (see rule 7(3)).



















COOKERY CORNER - EASY CHOCOLATE FUDGE CAKE

Even though it is the season of Lent, Refreshment Sunday which falls on Mothering Sunday, allows for the eating of Chocolate Fudge Cake!

Ingredients:

150ml sunflower oil, plus extra for the tin

175g self-raising flour

2 tbsp cocoa powder

1 tsp bicarbonate of soda

150g caster sugar

2 tbsp golden syrup

2 large eggs, lightly beaten

150 ml semi-skimmed milk

For the icing:

100g unsalted butter 225g icing sugar 40g cocoa powder 2½ tbsp milk.



Method:

Step 1 Heat the oven to 180°C/160° fan/Gas 4. Oil and line the base of two 18cm sandwich tins. Sieve the flour, cocoa powder and bicarbonate of soda into a bowl. Add the caster sugar and beat well with an electric whisk until smooth.

Step 2 Make a well in the centre and add the golden syrup, eggs, sunflower oil and milk. Beat well with an electric whisk until smooth.

Step 3 Pour the mixture into the two tins and bake for 25-30 minutes until risen and firm to touch. Remove from oven, leave to cool for 10 minutes before turning out onto a cooling rack.

Step 4 To make the icing, beat the unsalted butter in a bowl until soft. Gradually sieve and beat in the icing sugar and cocoa powder, and enough of the milk to make the icing fluffy and spreadable.

Step 5 Sandwich the two cakes together with the butter icing and cover the sides and the top of the cake with the remainder of the icing.

WATCHING THE WILDLIFE-

Spring is just around the corner, but even when the skies are unremittingly grey and you feel nothing much is moving, there are birds to watch. They may be sparrows pecking at seeds on the ground, a blackbird chasing off a rival male to reinforce the boundaries of his territory, or a crow calling to its fellows as they fly overhead. You have probably heard the birds singing more as they 'tune up' for their dawn chorus. Described by the RSPB as 'the voices of spring', it is a welcome sound, denoting brighter skies and warmer weather on the way. Whilst we know it's entirely possible to have disruptive snow in March, the knowledge that winter, however mild, has nearly passed is a cheering thought.

Although it doesn't seem long since the redwings arrived in October/November, flying overnight and calling to each other as they flew, they are now getting ready to leave again at the end of this month or next as they head back to Iceland, Scandinavia and the Faroes. Related to, but smaller than our resident thrushes, they

come to the UK to escape the colder winters of their more northern territories. Whilst you may have seen them enjoying the various fruits and berries in our trees, hedgerows and gardens, now that our winter is giving way to spring, and the winter fruits have mostly been eaten, you are more likely to see them in open fields searching for worms. Mixed in with any flock of redwings will probably be a flock of fieldfares. They often fly in mixed groups but with practice are easily told apart. Redwings are a rich warm brown with reddish underwings with a bold white line across the eyebrow. Fieldfares have more white/grey colour to their bodies and are slightly larger, being similar in size to a blackbird. A large flock of them has recently been swirling over fields in Marchamley and landing to feed on a daily basis - quite spectacular, with the fieldfares' grey and redwings' red plumage obvious!

Something else spectacular is the large flock of lapwings seen recently close to Tern Hill. These birds are in serious decline so to see a large flock of them is not only encouraging but a treasured sight for this area. Whilst northern European lapwings only spend their winter with us, many lapwings are UK resident all year round and all will soon be heading to their favoured breeding grounds. As ground nesting birds, they'll seek open fields of spring sown crops as well as meadows and fallow ground to lay their eggs and rear their

Improving weather will of course see hibernating creatures awake and begin their year, so there is much to look out for. Perhaps you'll see the first butterfly of the season in the next week or two. As bumble bees and solitary bees hibernate, whereas honey bees do not, they will all be emerging to enjoy the warm sun and seek the nectar of early flowering plants such as heather and primroses.

Whilst we're enjoying the spectacle of our various wild life, a note of caution from Shropshire Council: Bird flu has been confirmed in a wild owl on the north Staffordshire and Shropshire border. Everyone is urged not to touch sick or dead birds, but to report it to DEFRA who will organise the collection and testing of bodies.




