



State Pension

Calculating State Pension, Pension Credit, eligibility, claiming and deferring

If you are below state pension age, it is recommended that you check that you are on target for a full state pension. People who may have insufficient years include those who have lived abroad, retired before the state pension age, self-employed people whose Class II NIC record is not complete or people who have not

made sufficient contributions.

You should go to www.gov.uk/check-state-pension and follow the steps provided to find out if you have missing years and if you are able to top them up. You will need to set up a government gateway account (not as scary as it sounds) and will need your NI number, passport or driving license, a recent P60 if you have one and a phone that can receive texts.

If you decide that you want to top up some years you will need to call the number on the website. This is so you can find out what difference the top-ups will make to your state pension. WARNING: actually getting through on the phone took a very long time indeed but they were very helpful once connected. If you decide to go ahead and top up, you will be put through to HMRC and given a reference number and instructions on how to make the payment.

It is a bit of a convoluted process but one which could make a big difference to your personal finances. Originally the cut off for buying missing National Insurance years for your state pension back to 2006 was 31st July 2023 but this has now been extended to 5th April 2025.

COOKERY CORNER - CHEESE-STUFFED BURGERS

Ingredients:

For the burgers:

1½ tbsp olive oil
1 onion, very finely chopped
70g smoked pancetta, finely chopped
1 garlic clove, crushed
4 thyme sprigs, leaves picked
500g lean beef mine (no more than 10% fat)
50g fresh breadcrumbs
1 egg yolk
60g mature cheddar, grated
60g grated mozzarella

Method:

 Heat the oil in a frying pan over a medium heat and fry the onion with a good pinch of salt for 15 mins until soft and translucent. Add the pancetta and cook for 5 mins more, then add the garlic and thyme and cook for 2 mins. Remove from the heat and leave to cool for 15 mins.

2. Tip the mince into a large bowl. Massage with your hands for 5 mins to tenderise the

meat, then add the cooled onion mix, the breadcrumbs and egg yolk. Season generously. Divide evenly into four. Mix the cheddar and mozzarella together. Form the beef portions into patties, patting each into a 10cm round. Divide the cheese mixture into four and in your hands for each portion into a firm ball, then press into a roughly 4cm disc. Working one at a time, put a cheese disc into the centre of a beef patty, then bring the meat around the cheese to cover. Lightly pat with the palm of your hand to flatten slightly, then chill, covered, for at least 40 mins or up to 48 hours.

- 3. Make the sauce by whizzing the mayonnaise, mustard and herbs together in a small food processor. Stir through the gherkins, then cover and chill until ready to use.
- 4. Light the barbecue. When the flames have died down, grill the burgers on each side for 4 5 mins until charred. Wrap individually in foil and leave on the barbecue for 5 7 mins so the cheese centre melts.
- 5. Grill the buns, cut-side down, for 1 2 mins until toasted. Spread all the cut sides with the sauce, then fill with the beef patties, lettuce, tomatoes and crispy onions.

For the herby burger sauce:


120g mayonnaise
2½ tsp English mustard
½ small bunch of parsley, finely chopped
½ small bunch of basil
50g baby gherkins, finely chopped

To serve:



CHILDREN'S ACTIVITY - BBQ BUG LIGHT



To deter those unwelcome midges during your summer barbecues, deploy these decorated garden lights.

Equipment:

Jam or mason jars, paint brush, PVA glue, coloured tissue paper ripped into pieces, brown parcel paper, citronella tea lights and long matches or taper.

Method:

Start by painting PVA glue on one area of the jam jar at a time. Apply coloured tissue paper to the glued area. (Have a wet paper towel handy because little hands can easily get the glue on them and it makes it hard to attach the tissue paper with sticky hands). Use scraps of brown paper to make the tree trunks and attach them in the same way as the tissue paper. Put a top coat of glue over it all to ensure all loose bits of paper are glued on. Insert a tea light into the jar and light using a long match or taper.

WATCHING THE WILDLIFE

Just like life, there's good and bad in the garden. I'm sure we'd all like to think it's mostly good - until the snails severely 'prune' the tender new growth of the peas, the squirrels dig up some recently planted bulbs and the voles burrow under a plant, leaving its roots dangling in space underground, causing the plant to die. Nature eh?! However, when you're sitting in the warm sunshine, taking a welcome break from the rest of life's

concerns and a damselfly passes, their flight and colours can be mesmerizing. They're certainly one of the good things, they eat flies, mosquitos and other small insects and can be found anywhere where there's water or boggy, marshy land, be that lakes, ponds or streams. The British Dragonfly Society (which is concerned with both dragonflies and damselflies) is celebrating its 40th anniversary this year and their website will provide you with plenty of

information about both species: https://british-dragonflies.org.uk/about/our-work. This year, *Dragonfly Week* is $1^{st} - 8^{th}$ July. Like other creatures, many species of damselflies change colour as they mature. If you spot any dragonflies or damselflies when you're out and about visiting an open garden or a garden centre with a pond or lake or you're simply at home, the society would love you to report on them as knowledge of where these insects have been seen is being gathered for both research and conservation purposes.

The vagaries of our British summer weather mean you may be reading this while taking shelter from the heat of the sun or from a heavy downpour of rain. Thinking back to the hot spell in June, whilst the topsoil was drying and cracking in the heat, some new planting just had to be done in our garden. Gently digging down to make space for the plants, a frog came into view and seemed to glare at me, no doubt indignant at being dug up from their cool and damp refuge within the soil! Luckily no frogs were hurt by any hand forks or trowels but it was a reminder that wildlife really is all around us, even if we can't see it.



Last month also witnessed a young mole making slow progress as it crossed a local lane. It's fairly rare to ever see a mole above ground but it's interesting to see for yourself the large long-clawed 'spades' it has for its front feet, looking like 'paddles', which are so effective for digging. It was obviously heading off to begin life on its own. Having survived the passing of a car, it carried on and made it to the

other side. The average lifespan of a mole is 2½ years, with their breeding season being February to May. Young moles stay with their mothers until they are around 5 weeks old, at which time they head off on their own to find their own worm-rich territory, build their own burrow system and begin a solitary existence until it's time for them to breed. The different varieties of bees seem to be more in evidence in our garden than any butterflies so far this year, which is not good, especially as according to Butterfly Conservation (from data provided by thousands of volunteers) half of Britain's butterfly species are now endangered, vulnerable or threatened. Let's hope the second half of the year proves more encouraging. 'Wildlife Watcher'
