OBITUARY - ARTHUR BARNETT

22nd December 1934 – 13th August 2023

Many of our readers will remember Arthur Barnett who has died, aged 88, as he was Headmaster of Hodnet Primary School from September 1969 to July 1995 - a remarkable 26 years of service. In 1969 when Arthur moved to Hodnet with his wife Lily from Somerset, the Primary School was still at the old site in Hearne Lane, now the headquarters of the Scouts & Guides meetings. School lunches were provided in the Lyon Hall. There were various 'lollipop ladies' to see the children safely



across the road and the last of these was Lily Barnett, Arthur's wife. Arthur was invited to cut the first piece of turf for the building of the new school in its present site on 1st March 1985 and the new building was finally finished in May 1986. It was officially opened in October that year by HRH The Duchess of Gloucester. Arthur remained Headmaster at Hodnet School until his retirement in 1995.

Whilst living in Hodnet, Arthur threw himself into village life, for many years being chairman of the Hodnet & District Garden Club. He organised innumerable events for the primary school, and enjoyed taking part in the school plays and pantomimes.

Arthur was also a Lay Reader and gave many years of service to St Luke's Church in Hodnet and the Chapel of the Epiphany, Peplow. When he retired to Market Drayton after teaching, he also played a large part in the services at Christ Church, Little Drayton.



Arthur was made an Honorary Townsman of Market Drayton in January 2020 for his services to the town. He was the caller of the ceilidh band the Tern Valley Tinkers since the band was established in 2012, and the leader of the Market Drayton University of the Third Age country dancing group. He said at the time of the award, "I really don't think I deserve it because I have just enjoyed life. I have always believed that the more you put into something, the more you get out of it."

Arthur is survived by his wife Lily to whom he was utterly devoted. They had been married for 68 years.

PEPLOW NEWS - DEFIBRILLATOR

We are planning to have a Defibrillator (AED) in Peplow and are wanting to raise money towards its installation.

At present the survival rate for Cardiac Arrests outside hospital is less than one in ten. The timely use of an AED can produce survival rates as high as 80%, so there is no doubt that equipment in more isolated areas like Peplow is vital.

We are being supported by AEDdonate whose extensive knowledge of these devices has been invaluable. They have also set up a dedicated Fundraising Page. This is free, so 100% of donations go directly to the cause. We are also approaching local Charities and organisations for support.

COOKERY CORNER - AUTUMN PUDDING

This autumnal version of summer pudding is a great way of making the most of autumnal fruit. Serve with a drizzle of double cream. Serves 6. Cooking time 1 - 2 hours + overnight.

Ingredients:

400g English pears (such as Conference), peeled and cut into quarters

300g cooking apples (such as Bramley), peeled and cut into quarters

500g ripe plums, halved, stone removed

450g fresh blackberries


200g caster sugar

15g butter

Sunflower oil for greasing


10 thick slices white bread, crusts removed

Method:




- Remove the pan from the heat and pour the contents into a colander set over a large bowl. Leave to stand for 8-10 minutes, stirring once or twice so as much juice as possible is released by the fruit. You should end up with about 600ml.
- Pour the fruit juice back into the saucepan, bring to a simmer and cook for 10-15 minutes, or until the volume of the liquid has reduced by half. Remove the pan from the heat and set aside to cool for 20-30 minutes.
- 4 Lightly oil a 1.5 litre pudding basin and line with clingfilm, leaving plenty overhanging the edge. Cut a slice of bread using a circular cutter and dip it briefly into the fruit juice. Place in the base of the pudding basin.
- Cut the other bread slices in half and dip one at a time into the juice. Arrange in slightly overlapping vertical pieces around the inside of the basin, making sure they are soaked in juice without being soggy.
- Once all the sides of the basin are lined with bread, pour half of the remaining fruit juice over the drained fruit and stir very lightly until it looks plump and glossy. Spoon the mixture into the pudding basin.
- Dip the remaining slices of bread in fruit juice and place over the top of the pudding, trimming the bread where necessary to give a neat finish. Reserve any remaining fruit juice in a small bowl.
- Place the pudding onto a dinner plate. Cover the top of the pudding with the cling film, place a plate on top (make sure it fits inside the basin) and weigh down with a couple of tins. Chill in the fridge overnight.
- When ready to serve, remove the weights and plate and open the clingfilm. Place a serving plate on top of the pudding and invert. Remove the basin and peel off the clingfilm. Brush any gaps where white bread is showing with the reserved fruit juice.

























WATCHING THE WILDLIFE - IT WASN'T GOLD, BUT....

Did you see it? It's one of those occasions when you wait ages for one and then two come along in the same month! We're talking about the supermoon. Because August offered not just one supermoon on 1st August but another on 30th August, the second in the month is referred to as a blue moon. Supermoons are so called because they're bigger and brighter due to being closer to earth than usual. The first one in August was just 222,159 miles (357,530 kilometres) away and the one on 30th August was only 222,043 miles (357,344 kilometres) away. Blue moons are indeed a rare phenomenon, and one won't happen again until 2037.

Down to earth and this year's new frogs and toads are really growing apace, which is wonderful to see. It can, however, make gardening rather fraught as it's often only their sudden movement which gives their presence away, as they avoid humans digging and hoeing.

Whilst the recent rain and cool weather has curtailed butterfly activity, it hasn't stopped the bees from being out and about visiting flowers for the nectar and pollen which provide the protein they need to survive. The quality of the pollen varies from flower to flower; hence they need to be continually busy visiting flower after flower. There's another insect whose existence is very much welcomed and it's fascinating watching them prising open some varieties of flowers to get to the pollen.

Giving the opportunities for both intensive activity and therapeutic relaxing, gardening offers a good opportunity to be really close to nature. The chance to see frogs, toads, bees and the holes made by voles are just some of the joys of our rural lives.

This year's warm yet wet weather has seen our hedges ahead of usual in their rate of growth. Any impinging on highways and byways needs to be addressed, yet under the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 it is a criminal offence to cut or remove a hedge where birds are nesting. The offence carries an unlimited fine or up to six months in prison! By September, the birds have raised their young for this year and it should be safe to trim any hedges and trees now, although inspecting your hedge very carefully first is always recommended. It's awful to think that September augurs the end of summer and many of the birds which have graced us with their company during their breeding season will be migrating back to the warmer places they came from in our spring. The house martins have certainly detected the hints of change in temperature which herald our autumn.

In places, leaves in our garden have been reduced to skeleton leaf veins. The damage is fortunately only cosmetic as the plants do withstand the damage. The culprits are frequently the minute caterpillar-like larvae of a sawfly and these tiny green things with what looks like dinosaur-like spinal ridges can be seen rearing up when disturbed, making 's' shapes with their bodies and waving their rear ends. Fascinating!

This time of year still sees the year's young setting out on their own.

Sadly, many different creatures, ranging from hedgehogs to squirrels to frogs and toads fall victim to traffic, even on our relatively quiet country lanes and roads. Whilst we may consider our grey squirrels to be too prolific, our hedgehogs, frogs and toads certainly are not and we should treasure and encourage their survival.
