

WILDLIFE COMES CLOSE TO HOME

Relating my close encounter with a vole in the last issue, it was one of those coincidences that a few days later the national media revealed that a report, led by the RSPB and backed by more than 60 research and conservation groups, and updated from their 2019 report, discovered that our UK voles are in serious decline. We have 3 native species of vole in the UK: the water vole, bank vole, and field vole. The water vole is semi-aquatic and is sometimes referred to as a 'water rat', but

The water vole is semi-aquatic and is sometimes referred to as a 'water rat', but doesn't actually look much like a rat at all, primarily due to its size and more rounded nose.

The children's 1908 classic novel, 'Wind in the Willows' by Kenneth Grahame, featured the adventures of anthropomorphised creatures Mr. Toad, Mole, Badger and Ratty. The latter was a water vole, not, in fact, a rat, so either Mr. Grahame didn't appreciate the difference or perhaps he didn't like the idea of calling a character 'Voley'. Water voles, as you can guess, live alongside rivers, streams, lakes, ponds and areas of wetland, where they eat mainly grass and the plants alongside the water. Their fur is dark brown to almost black with a body length of approximately 12-23cm, (5-9") plus a tail length of 12cm.

The Wildlife Trusts have a national database and mapping project, recording sightings of water voles, which makes interesting viewing.

The bank vole and field vole are similar to look at, or rather catch glimpses of, as, being a prey species for such predators as owls, kestrels, weasels and cats, they don't stay still for long.

The bank vole is the smallest of our voles, being between 8-12cm (3-5") and has a richer reddish chestnut brown fur (with a white tummy and longer tail) than the other two species of vole. Living in gardens, hedgerows, parks and woodland, bank voles feed on nuts, fruit and small insects. They will also visit bird tables!

Our third vole, the field vole, is also known as the short-tailed vole, and has a body length of 8-13cm (3-just over



5"). They live in open areas of long grass, woodland and gardens too, although they're not good climbers so are unlikely to scale bird tables. Their fur is grey-brown on top with a pale grey tummy and is generally shaggier than the bank vole's fur.

The same report on the country's voles also alerted us to the fact that nearly half of our UK bird species are at risk of extinction, as are our native amphibians and reptiles. Our wildlife is precious and whilst it would be easy to dismiss such reports as 'doommongering' we know from our own sightings that our wildlife really is declining. Changing habitat and human activity account for a lot of it, so everything we can do to help all our creatures has to help. With winter approaching, I'm aiming to keep the bird feeders topped up, whether any voles climb the bird tables or not!

Whilst we personally hope a variety of birds will visit our garden, we don't aim to attract wood pigeons but they do visit. So too did a sparrowhawk the other day – it's not often you see a sparrowhawk about 4'/1.2 metres away on the ground, on your patio with a wood pigeon it's just killed! This female was certainly bringing nature close to home. What will you see this month?

NOVEMBER FESTIVALS

Festivals at the end of the year have their roots in pre-Christianity. For the pagan Celts, the New Year began on 1st November which was seen as the beginning of winter. On their New Year's Eve, 31st October, called All Hallows Eve (from which comes Hallowe'en), beasts that would not survive the winter were slaughtered and great bonfires were lit. Burning straw was also carried out in the fields to fertilise them for the following year. The tradition of lighting bonfires on 31st October was carried on until the time of the Gunpowder Plot in the 17th century, when it was moved to Guy Fawkes Night on 5th November.

All Saints' Day - 1^{st} November - commemorates the Christian belief that there is life after death. It is when Christians celebrate that all people who follow Jesus Christ and his teachings will be reunited in heaven after they die. All the saints, both known and unknown, are remembered. Nowadays, churches hold All Saints' Day services in which worshippers light candles to commemorate all the saints and martyrs who once inspired people to follow their example.

All Souls' Day - 2nd November — which is also known as The Commemoration of the Faithful Departed, commemorates the souls of those who have already died. In most European countries these days are used for visiting the graves of departed family and laying flowers. Many All Souls' Day traditions are associated with popular notions about purgatory. Bell tolling is meant to comfort those being cleansed. Lighting candles serves to kindle a light for the poor souls languishing in the darkness. Soul cakes (made of eggs, butter, sugar, milk, raisins and spices) are given to children coming to sing or pray for the dead (which probably gave rise to the Hallowe'en custom of trick-ortreating). Back in the early Christian times, poor people would visit the houses of the wealthier families and receive soul cakes in exchange for a promise to pray for the souls of the homeowners' dead relatives.

COOKERY - LAMB CURRY WITH BUTTERNUT SQUASH

Using minced lamb makes this curry recipe quick to make. You will need to brown the mince and cook the butternut squash until it begins to caramelise. Choose any curry paste you like (increase the quantity if you want it spicy!) and serve with rice or naan bread.

Serves 4 Prep time: 15 minutes Cook time: 35 minutes

Ingredients:

500g lamb mince

500g butternut squash (prepared weight), peeled, deseeded and cut into 1.5cm cubes

2 tbsp curry paste (we used tikka masala)

400ml coconut milk

150g spinach

1 tbsp olive oil



Method:

Step 1 Heat the olive oil in a large deep frying pan over a medium heat. Fry the lamb (in batches) until well browned. Use a slotted spoon to lift into a bowl and discard excess fat, if needed. Return the pan to a medium heat and add the butternut squash. Fry for about 8-10 minutes until beginning to caramelise.


Step 2 Return lamb to the pan with the curry paste and fry for 1 minute, stirring. Add 300ml of just boiled water. Bring to a simmer and bubble for 15 minutes until squash is tender.

Step 3 Add coconut milk and bubble for a few minutes. Fold through the spinach to wilt and season well to taste. Serve.






